

# Band Instrument Transpositions

## Examples:

Non-transposing instruments (piccolo, flute, oboe, bassoon, trombone, euphonium, tuba and mallets) play concert pitch.

When a B $\flat$  trumpet plays a D, the pitch that sounds is a concert C.

When a B $\flat$  clarinet plays an F, the pitch that sounds is a concert E $\flat$ .

When an F horn plays an F, the pitch that sounds is a concert B $\flat$ .

When a E $\flat$  alto sax plays a G, the pitch that sounds is a concert E.
